Overview

Applied Law and Criminology is a 2nd year Level 3 option for those Craven College students who have studied Level 3 Business, Public Services, Health & Social Care or Applied Science in Year 1. It is also open to school leavers who are 17+ and have completed a Foundation Diploma/AS Levels in their first year of 6th form.

This option is a perfect partner with Level 3 Business for those pursuing any business/law career, it adds value to those wanting to go into a Health & Social Care or social work related career as it gives an understanding of legalities. For Public services students, this qualification could give you a competitive edge on others when competing for careers in the forces. The benefits for Applied Science are clear with routes into forensics and criminology.
