Level 3 Year 2 Animal Management students enjoyed a trip to visit the University of Cumbria where they took part in a Zoology Day. Students heard lectures on coral reef research and conservation in the Philippines, whilst they learned about native species closer to home, such as reintroductions using the South Cumbrian Pine Marten Project, as an example of the tools used in field studies. The students then had the opportunity to participate in a practical session, where they were asked to model differing behavioural strategies to explain them as evolutionary adaptations.

#### **Leeds Bradford Airport Ambassadors**

The 2025 programme has just begun after three previous successful years.

20 students were successful at interview following a rigorous application process for these roles and any unsuccessful candidates were given feedback on what improvements to make on interview skills.

Leeds Bradford Airport hold two training courses for customer service and role expectations when on shift that involves assisting customers in the landside terminal area of the airport, answering flight information questions and general enquiries. Students also use terminology learnt in class in the correct manner and completing General Health, Safety and Security training before starting their first shift. Previous successful students have been trained and given airside passes to work further shifts in the summer at the boarding gates with handling agents. This has led to permanent employment and positions being created internally.

#### Land-based Departments Welcome Expert Speakers

With many students from College considering a career in rural trades, having guests with personal experience is a fascinating and vital insight into potential career routes.

Students heard an in-depth explanation of the day-to-day roles and duties of a Gamekeeper and how they run a managed moorland to assist with predator control, and to ensure the habitat remains in the best condition for growth and regeneration of flora and fauna.

The topic of managed shoots was sensitively discussed, with debate surrounding ethical and sustainable meat production, and how shooting days are measured and controlled.

Although the subjects discussed could have been controversial and sensitive in nature, all debates were respectfully conducted and students asked insightful questions and discussed how perceptions and opinions can change on emotive issues.

#### **Equine Arena Welcomes Experts for Demonstration**

The equine team from Aireworth Vets and Redwatch Cleckheaton, the specialist arm of West Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, attended Craven Equine Arena to deliver a series of demonstrations on large animal rescue and safety.

Redwatch Cleckheaton demonstrated techniques for moving a trapped horse, or a horse in distress to safety, using a fake horse, weighing in at around 200 lbs, designed to move as a horse would to cement techniques.

Aireworth Vets presented a guide to equine first aid including setting up a complete first aid kit for a yard, dressing a leg wound, and dealing with abscess care.

#### Work Experience Core Aim for Students at Evolve

At Evolve, students who choose a work experience core aim are placed in meaningful, long-term placements with local businesses for one or two days each week. This sustained approach allows them to develop industryspecific skills while gradually integrating into a professional environment. By collaborating closely with employers over an extended period, students build strong relationships, gain confidence, and develop a sense of loyalty to their workplace.

This hands-on experience provides students with valuable industry skills while often leading to part-time employment or apprenticeship opportunities. With 84% of Evolve students having an Education, Health and Care Plan, and many identifying as neurodiverse or having a disability, these placements play a crucial role in supporting individuals who may face additional barriers to employment. In the Ripon area, the Hospitality, Catering, and Care industries are key employers. We collaborate with The Old Deanery, Valentino's Ristorante, Realitea, The Ripon Inn, and Stepping Stones Nursery, to provide young people with valuable work placements in these high-demand sectors.

With the morning tailored perfectly to meet course requirements, tutors arrange this experience annually to cover the practical aspects of the course unit which covers 4x4 maintenance, off-road driving and recovery.

Applied Science students travelled to the University of Huddersfield to take part in a Chemistry and Forensic Science Experience Day. During this event, students took part in two activities. The first activity involved students using analytical techniques (melting point analysis and Infra-Red Spectroscopy) to identify an unknown white powder. In the second activity, students were tasked with using a range of forensic collection and analysis techniques to identify whether a stain on a garment was blood, and whether the hair present at a scene was human.

Taking part in this Experience Day gave our students valuable insight into Higher Education study and the types of tasks they may experience when in those job roles.

#### Tyro Training with Innovative Bootcamps

Since 2022 Craven College has delivered skills bootcamps for North Yorkshire in Land-based, Forestry and Arboriculture on behalf of the North Yorkshire Combined Authority.

Currently in the middle of 2024-2025 delivery that consists of 74 learners participating in the Skills Bootcamp, students can be employed, selfemployed or unemployed and develop those unique skills to bring significant value to the area of North Yorkshire.

Each employer/learner has the option of selecting approximately four courses from 22 qualifications that we provide from a suite of qualifications. This allows each bootcamp journey to be tailored to the needs of the business or the individual's career path.
